


Additionally, an intervention support class may replace 1 half-year elective if a student is not demonstrating consistent mastery of grade level skills. Students who fail an SOL test maybe required to take an elective academic preparation class. Students with an English Proficiency Level (ELP) of 1 through 4 are required to receive English Language Development services through our ESOL/Multilingual Learners program. Based on the WIDA Access for EIs assessment results, appropriate supports will be scheduled, possibly including a course that will replace an elective.
